This section was again amended in 2004, effective January 1, 2005, requiring the reorganization to take place at the same meeting at which the declaration of the election results is made and following the installation of the newly elected Councilmembers.

Following the oaths of office for, and the seating of, the newly elected Councilmembers, the chair should be turned over to the City Clerk to conduct the election for the Office of Mayor.

Following the election to fill the Office of Mayor, the new Mayor will assume the chair and conduct the election for the Office of Mayor Pro Tempore.

BACKGROUND:

The competition is open to all high school students, grades 9-12, who reside or attend school in the 34th Congressional District. The contractor will be responsible for providing all labor, materials, equipment, tools and incidentals necessary to complete the work requested in accordance with the project plans and specifications and as directed by Onward Engineering, who will provide inspection and materials testing services required by the project. The plans and specifications are based on a traffic index and geotechnical studies which found that the street pavement section are not design to support and withstand the existing traffic in the area. This work should have a useful life of 20 years. Staff is working with the United Family of Bristow to outreach the affected community.

FISCAL IMPACT:

This activity can be carried out at this time without additional impact on the current operating budget, as funding for this activity has been approved and included in the FY 2012/13 Capital Improvement Project Budget. As part of CIP budget, the City Council approved a project funding level of \$1,000,000 for design and construction, as follows:

The bid submitted from Sequel Contractors Inc., is \$745,550, which is \$182,240 under the engineer's estimate. Staff is recommending that a contract for \$745,550 be awarded to Sequel Contractors, Inc., and that a project contingency of 19% or \$143,262 be set aside to complete the proposed improvements.

RECITALS

CITY, by its Notice Inviting Bids duly advertised for written bids to be submitted on or before **February 15, 2013 at 3:00 p.m.**, for the following:

STANDARD CONTRACT 1209 BRISTOW PARK NEIGHBORHOOD STREET REHABILITATION PROJECT (CDBG PROJECT NO. 610357-09 & 610399-11) IN THE CITY OF COMMERCE

hereinafter called PROJECT.

At **3:00 p.m.**, on said date, in the Conference Room of the City of Commerce City Hall, said bids were duly opened.

At its regular meeting held on **March 19, 2013**, the City Council duly accepted the bid of CONTRACTOR for said PROJECT for being the lowest responsible, responsive bid received and directed that a written contract be entered into with CONTRACTOR. NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the premises and of the mutual covenants and agreements herein contained, said parties do hereby agree as follows:

ARTICLE I

The contract documents for the PROJECT shall consist of the Notice Inviting Sealed Bids, Instructions to Bidders, General Specifications, Standard Specifications, Special Provisions, Plans, CONTRACTOR'S Proposal, and all referenced specifications, details, standard drawings, and appendices, together with this Contract and all required bonds, insurance certificates, permits, notices, and affidavits, and also including any and all addenda or supplemental agreements clarifying, amending, or extending the work contemplated as may be required to insure its completion in an acceptable manner.

All of the rights and obligations of CITY and CONTRACTOR are fully set forth and described in the Contract Documents.

All of the above-mentioned documents are intended to complement the other documents so that any work called for in one, and not mentioned in the others, or vice versa, is to be executed the same as if mentioned in all of said documents. The

documents comprising the complete contract are hereinafter referred to as CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and are incorporated herein by this reference and made part hereof as though they were fully set forth herein.

ARTICLE II

For and in consideration of the payments and agreements to be made and performed by CITY, CONTRACTOR agrees to furnish all materials and perform all work required for the PROJECT and to fulfill all other obligations as set forth in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

ARTICLE III

CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to receive and accept the total amount of <u>SEVEN HUNDRED FORTY-FIVE THOUSANDS FIVE HUNDRED FIFTY DOLLARS (\$745,550)</u>, which is based on performing all of the bid quantities shown on Bid Schedule as full compensation for furnishing all materials, performing all work, and fulfilling all obligations hereunder. The final total amount to be paid to the CONTRACTOR shall be based on actual bid quantities completed. Said compensation shall cover all expenses, losses, damages, and consequences arising out of the nature of the work during its progress or prior to its acceptance including those for well and faithfully completing the work and the whole thereof in the manner and time specified in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, and also including those arising from actions of the elements, unforeseen difficulties or obstructions encountered in the prosecution of the work, suspension or discontinuance of the work, and all other unknowns or risks of any description connected with the work. CITY shall herein retain five percent (5%) of said price until said time as the provisions of Article XII herein have been met.

ARTICLE IV

CITY hereby promises and agrees to employ, and does hereby employ, CONTRACTOR to provide the materials, do the work, and fulfill the obligations according to the terms and conditions herein contained and referred to, for the said amounts set forth in Article III hereof, and hereby agrees to pay the same at the time, in the manner, and upon the conditions set forth in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS.

In addition, CONTRACTOR hereby promises and agrees to comply with all of the provisions of Federal and/or State law as the same shall apply to this PROJECT pertaining to the employment of unauthorized aliens as defined therein.

Should CONTRACTOR so employ unauthorized aliens for the performance of work and/or services covered by this contract, and should the Federal Government impose sanctions against the CITY for use of unauthorized aliens, CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to, and shall, reimburse CITY for the cost of all such sanctions imposed, together with any and all costs, including attorneys' fees, incurred by the CITY in connection therewith.

ARTICLE V

CONTRACTOR shall commence work on the date specified in the Notice to Proceed to be issued to said CONTRACTOR by the CITY and shall complete work on the PROJECT within the time schedule specified in the specifications.

ARTICLE VI

CONTRACTOR shall, without disturbing the condition, notify CITY in writing as soon as CONTRACTOR, or any Contractor's subcontractor, agents or employees have knowledge and reporting is possible, of the discovery of any of the following conditions:

- 1. The presence of any material that the CONTRACTOR believes is hazardous waste, as defined in Section 25117 of the Health and Safety Code;
- 2. Subsurface or latent physical conditions at the site differing from those indicated in the specifications; or,
- 3. Unknown physical conditions at the site of any unusual nature, different materially from those ordinarily encountered and generally recognized as inherent in work of this character provided for in this Contract.

Pending a determination by the CITY of appropriate action to be taken, CONTRACTOR shall provide security measures (e.g., fences) adequate to prevent the hazardous waste or physical conditions from causing bodily injury to any person.

CITY shall promptly investigate the reported conditions. If CITY, through the City Engineer or his/her, and in the exercise of its sole discretion, determines that the conditions do materially differ, or do involve hazardous waste, and will cause a decrease or increase in the Contractor's cost of, or time required for, performance of any part of the work, then CITY shall issue a change order.

In the event of a dispute between CITY and CONTRACTOR as to whether the conditions materially differ, or involve hazardous waste, or cause a decrease or increase in the Contractor's cost of, or time required for, performance of any part of the work, CONTRACTOR shall not be excused from any schedule completion date, and shall proceed with all work to be performed under the Contract. CONTRACTOR shall retain any and all rights, which pertain to the resolution of disputes and protests between the parties.

ARTICLE VII

CONTRACTOR shall assume the defense of and indemnify and save harmless the CITY, its elective and appointive boards, officers, agents and employees, from all claims, loss, damage, injury and liability of every kind, nature and description, directly or indirectly arising from the performance of the Contractor's work, regardless of responsibility of negligence; and from any and all claims, loss, damage, injury and liability, howsoever the same may be caused, resulting directly or indirectly from the nature of the work covered by the contract, regardless of responsibility of negligence; provided:

- (1) That CITY does not, and shall not, waive any rights against CONTRACTOR which it may have by reason of the aforesaid hold-harmless agreement because of the deposit with CITY by CONTRACTOR, of any of the insurance policies hereinafter described in this Agreement.
- (2) That the aforesaid hold-harmless agreement by CONTRACTOR shall apply to all damages and claims for damages of every kind suffered, or alleges to have been suffered, by reason of any of the aforesaid operations of CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor, regardless of whether or not such insurance policies shall have been determined to be applicable to any of such damages or claims for damages.

ARTICLE VIII

CONTRACTOR, before commencing said PROJECT, shall furnish and file with CITY, a bond, or bonds, in a form satisfactory to the CITY, in the sum of one hundred percent (100%) of the contract price thereof conditioned upon the faithful performance of this contract and upon the payment of all labor and materials furnished in connection with this contract.

ARTICLE IX

CONTRACTOR shall not commence work under this contract until CONTRACTOR shall have obtained all insurance required by the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS and such insurance shall have been approved by CITY as to form, amount and carrier, nor shall CONTRACTOR allow any subcontractor to commence work on any subcontract until all similar insurance required of the subcontractor shall have been so obtained and approved.

- (a) COMPENSATION INSURANCE. CONTRACTOR shall take out and maintain, during the life of this contract, Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of Contractor's employees employed at the site of improvement; and, if any work is sublet, CONTRACTOR shall require the subcontractor's similarly to provide Worker's Compensation Insurance for all of the latter's employees, unless such employees are covered by the protection afforded by CONTRACTOR. If any class of employees engaged in work under this contract at the site of the PROJECT is not protected under any Worker's Compensation law, CONTRACTOR shall provide and shall cause each subcontractor's to provide adequate insurance for the protection of employees not otherwise protected. CONTRACTOR shall indemnify CITY for any damage resulting to it from failure of either CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor to take out or maintain such insurance.
- (b) COMPREHENSIVE GENERAL LIABILITY, PRODUCTS / COMPLETED OPERATIONS HAZARD, COMPREHENSIVE AUTOMOBILE LIABILITY AND CONTRACTUAL GENERAL LIABILITY INSURANCE. CONTRACTOR shall take out and maintain during the life of this contract such comprehensive general liability, products/completed operations hazard, comprehensive automobile liability and contractual general liability insurance as shall protect the CITY, its elective and appointive boards, officers, agents and employees, CONTRACTOR, and any

subcontractor performing work covered by this contract, from claims for damage for personal injury, including death, as well as from claims for property damage which may arise from CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor, or by anyone directly or indirectly employed by either CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor's, and the amounts of such insurance shall be as follows:

- Public Liability and Property Damage Insurance in an amount of not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000);
- Products/Completed Operations Hazard Insurance in an amount of not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000);
- Comprehensive Automobile Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000);
- Contractual General Liability Insurance in an amount of not less than TWO MILLION DOLLARS (\$2,000,000);
- or GENERAL AGGREGATE LIABILITY in an amount of not less than FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000).

A combined single limit policy with aggregate limits in an amount of not less than FIVE MILLION DOLLARS (\$5,000,000) shall be considered equivalent to the said required minimum limits set forth herein above.

- (c) PROOF OF INSURANCE. The City of Commerce shall be named as "additional insured" on all policies required hereunder, and CONTRACTOR shall furnish CITY, concurrently with the execution hereof, with satisfactory proof of carriage of the insurance required, and adequate legal assurance that each carrier will give CITY at least thirty (30) days' prior notice of the cancellation of any policy during the effective period of this contract. Such insurance shall be primary and noncontributory with any other insurance maintained by the City of Commerce
- (d) NOTICE TO COMMENCE WORK. The CITY will not issue any notice authorizing CONTRACTOR or any subcontractor to commence work under this contract until CONTRACTOR has provided to the CITY the proof of insurance as required by subparagraph (c) of this article.

ARTICLE X

If any dispute shall arise concerning this Agreement, the prevailing party shall be entitled to attorney fees.

ARTICLE XI

The parties agree that it would be impractical and extremely difficult to fix the actual damages to the CITY in the event the PROJECT is not commenced and/or completed on or before the dates specified for commencement and completion of the PROJECT in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. The parties have considered the facts of breach of this contract and have agreed that the liquidated damages sum hereinafter set forth is reasonable as liquidated damages in the event of a breach, and that said sum shall be

presumed to be the amount of the damages sustained by the CITY in the event of such a breach. The parties therefore agree that in the event such work is not begun and/or completed and accepted by the times so specified in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS, the sum of Eight-hundred dollars (\$800) shall be presumed to be the amount of damages suffered by the CITY for each day's delay in the starting and/or completion and acceptance of said PROJECT after the dates specified in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS for the start and/or completion thereof, and CONTRACTOR hereby agrees to pay said sum of Eight-hundred dollars (\$800) as liquidated damages for each day of delay in the starting and/or completion and acceptance of said PROJECT beyond the date specified in the CONTRACT DOCUMENTS. Any and all such liquidated damage assessed shall be done so in accordance with that certain edition of the Specification for Public Works Construction, currently in effect as of the date of this Agreement.

ARTICLE XII

Contractor hereby promises and agrees to comply with all of the provisions of the Federal Requirements related to employment and labor relations.

ARTICLE XIII

Upon completion of the PROJECT and acceptance of same by the City Council, the CITY Manager shall have cause to be recorded a Notice of Completion with the office of the Los Angeles County Recorder; and, after thirty-five (35) days from the date said Notice of Completion is recorded, the Director of Finance of CITY shall release the funds retained pursuant to Article III hereof; provided there have been no mechanics' liens or stop notices filed against said work which have not been paid, withdrawn or eliminated as liens against said work.

ARTICLE XIV

This contract shall not be assignable, either in whole or in part, by the CONTRACTOR without first obtaining the written consent of the CITY thereto.

ARTICLE XV

The provisions of this agreement are cumulative and in addition to and not in limitation of any rights or remedies available to CITY.

ARTICLE XVI

If either party to this agreement is required to initiate or defend, or is made a party to, any action or proceeding in any way connected with this agreement, the party prevailing in the final judgment in such action or proceeding, in addition to any other relief which may be granted, shall be entitled to reasonable attorney's fees. Attorney's fees shall include reasonable costs for investigating such action conducting discovery and all other necessary cost the court allows, which are incurred in such litigation.

The provisions of this agreement are cumulative and in addition to and not in limitation of any rights or remedies available to the CITY.

REQUEST FOR FUNDING TO REPAIR THE BRISTOW PARK SPRAY SUBJECT:

POOL AND THE BRENDA VILLA AQUACTIC CENTER POOL DECK

RECOMMENDATION:

Staff is recommending that Council allocate the unencumbered balance of \$53,000 from the FY 2012/2013 CIP budget to repair the Bristow spray pool and Brenda Villa Aquatic Center pool deck. The Bristow Park spray pool is in need of a new safety texture coating for the outer deck and concrete benches surrounding the pool. The pool deck in the Brenda Villa Aquatic Center has become a slip hazard and is in need of concrete diamond stamping that will provide a much safer walking surface for patrons.

MOTION:

Move to approve the recommendation.

BACKGROUND:

At a recent Council meeting, the Parks and Recreation Department was asked to renovate the Bristow Park spray pool by adding a new texture coating to the deck area. This is similar to the repairs that were completed at the Bandini Spray Pool, last year. The cost for this project is approximately \$14,000.

At the Brenda Villa Aquatic Center, the Parks and Recreation Department would like to utilize a floor scoring process, which improves traction and reduces the risk of slips and falls, especially on wet floors. This process is extremely effective when installed on concrete. The cost for this project is approximately \$39,000.

ANALYSIS:

The Department would like to proceed with the same process at the Bristow Park spray pool that was employed Bandini Park Spray pool, which includes removing the old coating and applying a non-slip texture coating to the surface of the perimeter of the pool area

At the Brenda Villa Aquatic Center, the Department would like to proceed with a concrete stamping process that provides a permanent slip resistant floor surface to the existing concrete deck.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The funds needed to complete both projects will be approximately \$53,000 (\$14,000 for Bristow Park spray pool and \$39,000 for BVAC). This funding will come from an unencumbered balance from the approved the FY 2012/13 Capital Improvement Budget. Given that we are 9 months into the current fiscal year FY 2012/2013, use of the \$53,000 in unencumbered CIP funds at this juncture is an appropriate expenditure for this needed repair.
