5. Injury Review for April 2014

- While conducting tree string trimming duties, employee stepped on a rock while stepping off the curb: Preventable
- While teaching swimming lessons and moving from large pool to small pool, employee stubbed second right toe: Preventable
- While walking in front of Rosewood park staff office, employee tripped and fell on uneven pavement; rolled right ankle, landed on right knee and right elbow: Preventable
- Became overwhelmed with peer issues and resulted in headache: Preventable

6. Unfinished Business

- Mr. Casalou provided update on high curb at west side of City Hall and shared that asphalt was going to be applied at a slope with a yellow cautionary stripe to alert patrons and employees of modified entrance. Modified entrance design is intended to be a temporary fix in an effort to prevent further injuries from occurring at this location.
- Melaina Francis commented that slips, trips and falls web-based training and videos are available as resources through CJPIA to assist in providing employees with knowledge in these areas.
- Miguel Romero will follow-up on fire hose determination and report his findings at our next meeting.
